

Sunflower faith

When I was at university studying languages, I spent a year in France. One thing I quickly learned was that the French don't queue. I could wait twenty minutes for a bus then when it came thirty people would suddenly appear and get on in front of me. Yet here too we seem to be growing less patient, more demanding, more stressed. We complain if there are more than two people ahead of us at the supermarket checkout as we buy our 'microwave-in-five-minutes' meals. You can't drive along our formally quiet country lanes without someone right on your tail, desperate to get past. We expect things to be done 'while we wait' and call even the first-class post 'snail mail'. The whole pace of life is faster, more hectic. And so we find it harder to wait for



things and when we are forced to slow down or even stop altogether due to illness, age, unemployment or retirement, we find it even harder because we have virtually lost that ability together with any sense of the value of waiting. This is also reflected in the commercial world and our consumer society. Hot cross buns and Easter eggs appeared on supermarket shelves almost before the mince pies and Christmas puddings had gone and the latter in turn had been on sale from early autumn. Again, we are losing the ability to pace ourselves, to observe the seasons and mark the festivals without allowing them to merge into one another and cease to be special.

For some, Lent will feel like a long, austere wait for the celebrations of Easter but it is a gift of time: the time to think, to reflect upon our life and the way we are living it; time to reconsider our direction of travel and reorientate ourselves. The very word comes from the Latin for 'east', 'sunrise', thus to orientate ourselves means to turn towards the rising sun – for Christians the rising Son of God. Lent for us is a slow, considered turning away from all that has blocked the light in our lives, relationships, attitudes and actions and a turning towards the light of God's forgiveness, healing, reconciliation and new life in Jesus Christ. Rather than rushing into the celebrations of Easter, we embrace this quieter, slower time of reflection and preparation.

For Jesus' friends before the first Easter it was by contrast a time of relentless activity. After three years on the road, they entered the capital city of Jerusalem, accompanied by excited, noisy crowds. Jesus' last days were spent driving traders and moneylenders out of the Temple, then teaching, healing and meeting people and the different religious groups, as well as his friends. Then came the activity of others: betraying Jesus - arresting, trying, torturing, flogging and finally crucifying him, then taking him down from the cross and burying him. His female friends, mostly ignored by the authorities and crowds, followed every step of the way. They watched by the cross till he died then followed to the tomb. Then they went straight off home to prepare spices and oils to anoint the body. It was all go. But then. Then they were forced to stop. It was the Sabbath. No activity was permitted. They had to wait. To endure.

And in the waiting time, in the darkness whilst they were inactive, huge and incredible changes took place. Had they been able to return straight away to the tomb with their spices, they would have found a body, cold and lifeless; they would have encountered death. But in their waiting, God moved and acted so what they found was life; they encountered the newly alive Jesus outside an empty tomb. And from then on, the whole direction of *their* life changed.

To many, this will seem a nonsense and they will prefer to trust their own activity, to keep moving, keep busy, try to keep things under their control. To others, however, it will become a beacon of light which will enable their own waiting to be endured with hope and courage and help them to reorientate themselves. For yet others, the waiting will still be like the waiting of those women - a dark waiting, full of despair and grief. Yet even in that darkness, new life stirred and broke forth. On Easter morning the Son rose and if we, like sunflowers, turn our faces towards him, our own life will be transformed, made new.





Your Church Needs Funds For Essential Unforeseen Electrical Work Costing £40,000

Following our statutory 5-year inspection, issues were identified, particularly with old wiring and fittings. To address these issues, the church is being partially rewired, together with some upgrading of the electrical fitments.

Work started in January with the erection of scaffolding and will continue for some time. Services have been taking place in the adjoining Jubilee Room. However, it is anticipated that it will be possible for some services to resume being held inside the church itself soon.

It is always a challenge, not least financially, when substantial works needs

to be done and we do put out a call for help and support when that occurs.



Reducing plastic - helps your health and helps the environment

Many people will have been shocked by recent press reports based on work by Columbia and Rutgers Universities which found roughly 240,000 detectable plastic fragments in a typical litre of bottled water. It is now known that plastic from packaging accumulates in many organs in your body including lungs, heart, blood etc -and it can stay there for life contributing to disease and ill health.

Humans produce more than 440 million tonnes of plastic annually, according to the UN. About 80% of plastic goes to landfill or into the environment.

While the scale of the problems seem overwhelming there are things we can do to limit the plastic we absorb into our bodies, and reduce pollution and help the planet. In 2022, a quarter of a million people from households, schools, businesses and communities across the country - including Shamley Green residents - made **The Big Plastic Count** the biggest ever investigation into UK household plastic waste. By counting plastic waste for 1 week, the shocking truth was revealed that the UK throws away 2 billion pieces of plastic every week, only 12% of which is recycled.

In 2024, world governments will be negotiating a Global Plastics Treaty that could finally phase out plastic production for good. And so, **The Big Plastic Count** is happening again - this time the results will try to convince the UK government to do the right thing and lead the way at these talks, and push for a really strong treaty. This can only help our environment - and our health.

If you would like to take part the count is taking place from 11 to 17 March. It's very easy and a simple 'how to' guide can be found on the website. If you prefer not to do the survey online they will send you an information pack.

Cutting down on food waste - another thing that is good for the environment, and for your finances

Most food waste in the UK happens in our homes. In 2021 figures show that 60% of UK food waste was by people in their homes: 6.4 million tonnes of food and drink was thrown away of which 4.7 million tonnes could have been eaten.

Restaurants and supermarkets have had a bad press about food waste and have taken steps to reduce it to 12%. About 28% is wasted during manufacture or on the farm, so now the main culprit is all of us throwing our food away instead of eating it! Here are a few of the rather alarming facts from the latest WRAP report.

Potatoes, cooked leftovers from both homemade and pre-prepared meals, and bread top the UK's wasted food table. UK households throw away 300,000 tonnes of meat and fish a year costing £3.2 billion.

A four-person household spends on average around £1,000 per year on food bought but not eaten. Local authorities spend around £510 million per year disposing of or treating food waste.

The theme for Food Waste Action week for 2024 (18th-24th March) is **Choose What You'll Use.** Supermarkets and shops are committed to removing packaging from twenty-four fruits and vegetables by 2025. Shamley Green Gardening Club

The first club talk of 2024 began with a well filled hall looking forward to a talk by the delightfully named Daisy Day. Daisy had very kindly stepped up to fill the gap when our booked speaker was unable to come. She is one of only 2 master beekeepers in Sussex (there are only just over 100 in England and Wales) having qualified in 2012, and currently runs over 100 colonies in West Sussex with her husband, who she met through beekeeping! She began by identifying the 3 levels of honeybee found in a colony: a queen, worker bees (all female) and drones - the males. There were a satisfactory number of "idle and of dubious use" guips about the drones before she continued with an account of the hive activity over the year leading to the gathering of honey. A reminder of the best plants to grow for bee support wound up this talk from a true enthusiast who loves her bees. And apparently, when all drones are removed from a colony, the female workers go into decline..... must be a lesson there somewhere! Linda Penny

History Society—Sid Stevens

When the History Society held their annual new year lunch at the Bricklayers, early in January, members were invited to bring a red item along and give a brief talk, before the food was served. I produced my Sweeney Scarf, red and white and showing support for Guildford City F.C. I highlighted SID STEVENS. who part of the Stevens family lived around the Green for many years. He was a local sportsman, particularly at cricket and football, and was goalkeeper for the village team. In the summer of 1953 he signed on, as an amateur, for Guildford City, who were then a semi professional club competing in the Southern League, the highest level of football below the football league. This was a very big 'step up' and Sid stayed with the club for three years. To begin with he had to compete with three other goal keepers at the club, one of them being Ray Drinkwater, who went on to Queens Park Rangers and became their regular goalkeeper for many seasons.,

For the first year Sid took his place in the reserve side, but at the beginning of the second season he made many appearances in the first team. Playing away matches was no easy task, (this was not called the Southern League for nothing) an area covering the whole of Southern England, from Exeter to Gravesend, and the South Midlands from Kettering to Gloucester. There were also four clubs in Wales. Some of these games away from home were played in mid week, which meant players had to get time off from work.

By the start of the third term Sid had established himself as first choice keeper. Although Manager Archie Macaulay had left the club by Christmas, the team were well on their way to winning the League Championship which they achieved by MAY 1956. There were great celebrations at the club when this happened, The players, directors and especially the fans were over joyed. Unfortunately Sid had been 'dropped' from the first team at the beginning of March. A new goalkeeper had been 'signed on' and Sid never got his place back. As a result Sid was unable to take part in any of the celebrations, including the presentation of players medals and the celebration dinner at the Lion Hotel. He was entitled to a medal because of the number of games he had played during the season, but he had to collect it from the club.

By the summer of that year he had left the club. He played briefly for a couple of clubs in the Kent League, and then with a heavy heart retired from the professional game.
