. Lest we forget

Remember, remember

As our local charities start to build their bonfires, I can't help but remember the tributes paid to Don Nunneley, a much loved member of our village and church community who recently died. A lasting memory for many is that whilst hundreds of people stood around him with flaming torches, he used to climb the massive Cranleigh bonfire to read the Guy Fawkes Night verse, 'Remember, remember the Fifth of November'. Of course, he then had to get back down at breakneck speed to avoid the hail of blazing torches thrown to light the fire, frightening the life out of his wife and young sons. November is the month of remembrance, in more ways than one. 2nd November is All Souls' Day when we



especially remember those who have died. At Christ Church we have a special service and tea each year on the first Sunday in November to do this. When someone you love dies, after a while everyone else moves on with their life but you are left with that loss. Keeping All Souls' Day is a way of saying that both those who have died and those who grieve are not forgotten in our busy lives but have a place in our thoughts and concerns, a place in our crowded schedules. It also reminds us that when Jesus Christ rose from death, he opened the way for us into life beyond what we know here on earth. 'In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?' (Jesus' famous words in the Gospel of John.)

Gunpowder, treason and plot

5th November marks the failure of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605, in which Catholic conspirators plotted to blow up the Houses of Parliament and assassinate the king. It is a good opportunity, not just for a fireworks party, but also to remember our new King, his Government and Opposition, including a new Prime Minister and Cabinet, and all those who take on the responsibility of government, especially those who risk their own security and health to do so. It is easy to criticise politicians and leaders but not so easy to do their job! As we look around the world, may we never cease to appreciate that we live in a democracy and in a country where freedom of speech is upheld, together with many other freedoms we often take for granted.

At the going down of the sun and in the morning

Remembrance Sunday (this year 13th) is our time for specifically remembering those who have died in the defence of those freedoms and those who have suffered injury, trauma and disability. We keep the two-minute silence as a sign of respect and honour. It also serves to stop us in our tracks lest we forget the need night and day to work for peace and justice in a world still too prone to resort to violence as a solution to its problems and disputes.

A different kind of calendar

It is also time to make sure you have got your Advent calendar. This is not just for a

daily fix of chocolate because Advent (which begins on 27th) is also a time for remembering. We remember that Jesus promised to come again: 'And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also.' (John's Gospel as above). Advent is bittersweet: those who are struggling with life may look forward to the day Jesus will come, bring their suffering to an end and 'take them home', while those who have a good and comfortable life may feel differently. Many of us may quail at the thought of meeting God face to face – are *you* ready? Advent remembering, therefore, can bring hope and encouragement as well as challenge and new direction.

A minute silence

The church magazine from my husband's home parish recorded the death of a member of the community in whose memory 'a minute silence was held'. A funny misprint but for some of us, a minute silence is all we feel we can fit in to our busy lives and our preoccupied selves. So my suggestion for this month of November is that we take more than a minute or two, to pause and be silent and remember the most important things and people in our life – and to remember our God who loves us and is preparing a place for us.



Shamley Green History Society

For our September meeting Michael Gilbert gave us a most interesting talk about the Great Exhibition of 1851, emphasising the truly enormous scale of the undertaking, the complexity of which was well illustrated by the fascinating contemporary lithographs done by artists at an age before photography. The scale of the undertaking was astonishing, not only the structure of the Crystal Palace which was erected in Hyde Park, but the number of exhibits (over 100,000!) and the fact that it had over 6 million visitors. The exhibits included almost every marvel of the Victorian age, including pottery, porcelain, iron-work, furniture, perfumes, pianos, firearms, fabrics, steam hammers, hydraulic presses, a model house for 4 families designed by the Prince Regent, and a fully grown Elm tree..







Further to last month's article on the Plastics Survey, below is advice on what WE can do.

What about us?

Some members of the Shamley Green Environment Group took part in this survey and we were surprised by the amount of plastic we threw away. We all want to try and use less plastic. We agreed recycling plastic may make us feel better but it is not the solution.

!0 things we can all do to help cut our use of plastic and be more effective recyclers

- Identify products which can be bought loose or refilled and DO IT !!
- Take our own bags when we shop for loose fruit and vegetables
- Take our own containers with us - shops nowadays are usually happy to put meat, fish, bakery and other items in your own containers
- Look at a few of the worst offenders we buy and write to the suppliers asking them about their plans to change to non-plastic packaging
- Rule out buying products in Tetra Pak or similar laminated packaging or other composite materials which seldom get recycled properly
- Try switching to tins or jars instead of plastic (ketchup etc)
- Be sure to recycle properly – remove lids from glass bottles and jars, keep lids on plastic bottles, do not put polystyrene or black plastic or plastic bags in the recycling. Make sure our containers and trays are clean and free from grease
- Dispose of soft plastic separately, not in our recycling bins
- Try and find and support inventive packaging solutions, such as seaweed

Update on Ponds and Ditches

It was sad to see the village ponds dry during this summer's drought. Lots of Surrey ponds suffered the same fate, but we did discuss with Waverley the land owner and other pond experts whether there were any emergency measures that might alleviate the situation. We were advised not to disturb the ponds during the summer when amphibians and other plant and animal life is most active. Interestingly, although the water had gone there were still froglets in the silt on top of the clay lining in the Duck Pond. Happily, water has now returned to both ponds.

We have used the summer to better understand the pipes and ditches that feed the Duck Pond so that work can be done to clear them and reduce the chances that future droughts will lead to the pond drying up and to monitor water levels in the Duck Pond more closely. The usually muddy footpath next to Mellow House that runs up to Woodhill Lane has also been investigated and found to have a blocked and possibly broken storm water pipe under it, which if cleared could improve the flow to the Duck Pond. We have consulted some local residents, plus a local water engineer, amphibian and plant experts and agreed on the clearance of ditches and some of the vegetation around both ponds. The ditches on Duck Pond common will be cleared this winter. The rotting upper layer of wood revetment along the Woodhill Lane side of the Duck Pond will be replaced over the winter to hold the bank in place. The Parish Council are awaiting contractor quotes for this work. This has been slower than we hoped with contractors blaming labour shortages.



There have been suggestions that silt should be removed from the Duck Pond. This will need to be done at some stage but is not urgent - a layer of silt protects the clay lining from cracking in times of drought - and will require permission from Waverley and probably Natural England. We hope to get that agreement in place in time for the next drought. It has also been suggested that the Duck Pond should be butyl lined. We have consulted experts and contractors about this. Their view is that it would be practically difficult, liable to tree root damage and very expensive so we do not intend to take that suggestion further.
