# Cherry picking

As I write this, Kevin and I are preparing to pick our cherries. No, not in the vicarage garden but an orchard in East Sussex. For a rather different Christmas present one year I rented Kevin a cherry tree there and eleven years later we still have the same tree. The chaps who run the orchards look after it for us all year and even send us newsletters informing us of its progress. We go to visit it when it is in blossom and then finally in July we get to pick the cherries. It's only a small tree yet we have frequently picked 15kg/34lb of large, sweet, juicy cherries and even on a year when the weather has not been propitious, our little tree has still proved amazingly fruitful.



In the Bible fruit and fruitfulness are a recurring theme. It begins with God's fruitfulness in creation, bringing forth "fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it" (Genesis 1:11-12) and that bit about the seed is not an insignificant detail: fruit that has the seed in it will produce another tree bearing fruit with the seed in it, and so on. It is a picture of endless bounty and harvest as God gives them to the human beings he has made: "I have given you every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food" (1:29). And God's command to the man and woman is that they in their turn should: "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth" (1:28). Of course, we know what happens next in *that* story: the woman and man prove to be the very opposite of fruitful, i.e. greedy. Although God has given them all the trees of the garden with their fruit, they desire the one fruit he has forbidden them to eat, for their own good, "for in the day that you eat of it you shall die" (2:17).

It would be the story of God and his people for many millennia to come. God would provide; the people would grab and exploit and spoil what he had given. Again and again God would make his promises of fruitfulness, only desiring that his people might live in peace, enjoying the fruits of the land and being fruitful themselves. Again and again it would go wrong or, more accurately, people would get it wrong so two questions spring to mind:

firstly, what hinders our growth or prevents us bearing fruit in season?

secondly, what might being fruitful actually mean?

We have a role to play and a contribution to make if there is to be a harvest. Kevin and I go and pick our cherries but there is considerable hard work behind that particular harvest; the newsletters told us of the winter jobs of laying drainage pipes, replacing broken poles and wires, mending nets and removing the remaining mouldy cherries from the trees, removing unfruitful trees and servicing the tractors; then in early spring erecting new posts and wires and planting new trees; in later spring netting the trees after the blossom and re-netting when the winds tear them up, taking leaf samples and sending them off to a lab to be analysed to determine which nutrients are lower than they should be and replacing them in a feed spray... Our tree has been loved and looked after, protected from predators, fed with exactly the right food. With God's contribution of sun and rain, no wonder it produces a fine

crop. So if we are to bear fruit, we need to attend to our own cultivation, ensuring we receive the appropriate nourishment and nurture, drawing on God for his help too and not simply ignoring our needs or being too busy to attend to our own development.

And if we do this, what are we aiming or hoping for? Fruit and fruitfulness, yes, but what *is* that? Well, just think of all the wonderful summer fruit around us at the moment: it provides nutrition, essential vitamins; it is juicy and refreshing especially in hot weather; through seeds and cuttings and runners it produces further fruit; it can be overwhelming in its profusion and it is great to share. How wonderful if we could be fruitful like that - providing nourishment for others, a refreshment and aid to those who are weary with 'the changes and chances of this fleeting world', always growing and generous in sharing the fruit we bear.

Jesus said to his friends at the Last Supper: "My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples... You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last". (John's Gospel Chapter 15)

# SHAMLEY GREEN GARDENING CLUB

## Garden Tour Summer 2021 Kent

It has been a difficult and frustrating 18 months for most people, not least those trying to organise events and holidays. Penny and Tony have been no exception having to manage a year's delay, withdrawal of some venues and participants and the regulations imposed by coach companies and hotels. However, a drizzly morning in June saw 31 hopefuls board the coach (usual driver Brian but sadly no Danish pastries due to you know what) and set off for the neighbouring county of Kent.

We were very soon at the first stop- Chartwell, the former home of Winston Churchill.

Sir Winston lived at Chartwell from 1922 for over 40 years and the house is presented very much as it was then with displays of his many paintings and prolific books. The stop for lunch gave time to enjoy the beautiful gardens, particularly the Rose Garden which was a favourite of Lady Churchill and a glorious Golden Rose Avenue filled with roses of every shade of yellow. Next stop Broadview, the site of Hadlow Horticultural College. Two years ago this was a stunning exhibition of student projects but sadly interruption to the courses has meant the gardens are now very unkempt. There was evidence however of former glories, a Japanese garden, an area planted with enormous leaved tropical plants and a garden full of lovely and unusual old roses. Hopefully the next few years will see a return to its former condition. Then to our home for the next 4 nights, the Marriott Tudor Park Hotel near Maidstone. Predictably there were a number of Covid led rules but in true SGGC style the group managed to, legally, rearrange things to ensure as pleasant a stay as possible!

Bright and early start next morning and off to Doddington Place. Past members of the Gardening Club trips may remember that we always like to challenge driver Brian with almost inaccessible lanes and hidden venues. I'm pleased to report that Kent was no different. The approach road was closed and single width lanes busy with oncoming traffic. Luckily when faced with a 50 seater coach most drivers accept defeat. The large late 19<sup>th</sup> century house looked quite foreboding in the damp and misty morning, but the weather only enhanced the wonderful perennials in the sunken garden beds surrounding a central pond and the atmospheric Edwardian rockery, all enhanced by the presence of the knowledgeable green haired head gardener. After our visit it was announced that Doddington Place Gardens have been nominated for Historic Houses garden of the year. Coffee and cake was enjoyed before going on to Marshborough Farmhouse which turned out to be Member's favourite garden. Owned by a plantaholic farmer and his wife it is a garden of great character, full of scent from trees, shrubs and perennials, all labelled! It was voted the best NGS garden she had ever seen by one of our knowledgeable members, praise indeed. Many of the incredible range of plants have been raised by the owners from seed; the soil is an acidic sandy loam which means a wide range of plants from Australia, New Zealand and the Mediterranean can be grown. We were extremely lucky to see this amazing private garden as the owners are not opening it in the future. Andy Murray won!

Marshborough was a hard act to follow but the next morning stepped up to the mark, seeing us at Lullingstone Castle, the family home of Tom Hart Dyke since the end of the 15<sup>th</sup> century. Many people are familiar with Tom's terrifying experience of being kidnapped in Columbia while orchid hunting in 2000. While in captivity he created a design for a garden containing plants collected on his trips laid out in the shape of a world map and after his fortunate release he returned home to build it. Tom must be one of the most enthusiastic people on the planet - this was one garden where we could have stayed all day among the Wollemi pine (the oldest tree in the world) in the Australian border, the world's rarest Gum tree (flowering in the Tasmanian section for the first time in 2009) the world's most dangerous plant, the Queensland Stinger and the 'Hot and Spikey' Cactus House containing nearly 2000 varieties of cacti, succulents and bromeliads. But we had to move on – next stop Hever Castle, the childhood home of Anne Boleyn and later the home of W.W. Astor. Members enjoyed an audio guided tour of the castle before heading out into the gardens, unfortunately into torrential rain. William Astor added the beautiful Italian garden to display his collection of statuary and this, together with the rose garden form an elegant promenade, given better weather! A return visit possibly. England won!

Wednesday – wet again but by the time we arrived at Walmer Castle it was just damp! Walmer Castle has a fascinating history built as a Tudor artillery fortress and becoming a home for the Lords Warden of the Cinque Ports including the Duke of Wellington, Pitt the Younger and Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother. Members again had the chance to tour the Castle before wandering around the delightful grounds. Highlights were a colourful herbaceous bed backed by an impressive cloud hedge, a tranquil Queen Mother's Garden (given to her for her 95<sup>th</sup> birthday) and a lovely shady woodland walk to a recently restored sunken

glen, a magical hollow full of ferns, woodland plants and mosses. Being alone in this cool quiet spot was really quite special. Walmer showed its historical ability to cope with alarms when the entire staff was alerted to a missing raincoat. All were on watch – until the missing item was spotted being sat on by another of the group; the member owner was most impressed (and



embarrassed!). Our afternoon visit was to Mount Ephraim, a privately owned family home run as a wedding venue and B and B. The ten acres of charming Edwardian gardens comprise rose terraces, *(continued on page 20)*

Each member has their own reasons for leaving, and these were outlined at the Hall AGM on 26-Apr-21. Having served in a voluntary capacity for a combined time in excess of 60 years, below is a record of our achievements during this time.

Since the start of the outgoing Chairman's tenure, the following changes and improvements have been made to the Hall, in addition to minor improvements, and on-going maintenance and repairs:

- Two new kitchens, including units and appliances
- A veranda
- Showers for the Cricket Club
- Double glazing throughout
- New front, back, and side doors
- Ladies rest room refurbishment
- Several complete re-decorating cycles
- New flooring for main hall, bar room, kitchen and backstage areas
- Re-wiring to regulatory compliance
- Installing a disabled WC
- Acoustic panel renewal
- Stage curtains
- New Bar Room
- Provision of external electrical services for Fete, vendors, etc.

All of these improvements were paid for through fund-raising functions, several grants, and some donations. Although very welcome, grants and donations were never expected or guaranteed, so the focus has always been on fund-raising – organised by Committee members and their friends and families. Events organized included Race Nights, Quiz Nights, Lunches, Dinners, and have raised in excess of £50,000 during the current Committee's tenure. Further Hall income came from lettings, and the 200 Club, which provides ring-fenced funding for hall repairs and maintenance. All activities have been reported regularly in the Parish Magazine, with a yearly Parish-wide advertised 'Open to All' AGM. The latter, until this year, being generally poorly attended, sometimes by as few as 2 guests.

Around seven years ago, it became clearly apparent to the Committee, following a steep decline in lettings/income, that the Hall required considerable financial investment, or a complete rebuild to bring it into line with other local Halls, and the village's 21<sup>st</sup> Century requirements. After a Village Consultation in 2015 and a Parish-wide vote, resulting in a majority of those voting being in favour of a New Hall, architects were selected, plans drawn up, together with full village consultation each step of the way, and finally, after several reiterations, a planning application was submitted. For various reasons already made public, this was not granted, and the application came to an end in April 2021.

During the past 5 years whilst planning was in progress, together with the Hall's mandatory closure due to Lockdown, the Committee have continued with general maintenance as and when required such as addressing damp issues, roof repairs, replacing rotten roof timbers in the Kitchen, together with a repaint of the affected areas.

After the planning decision, the current committee made it very clear through its' usual communication routes, that there were some serious maintenance issues looming, particularly the condition of the flat roofed areas, and that these would need attention and funding, in the short to medium term ahead.


Despite the lack of income during the last 18 months of Lockdown, the Hall fabric and finances are now as they would have been, should the Planning exercise not have been undertaken. The costs of the Planning Application have been largely met by fundraising, and on-going repair needs have been met. There are maintenance issues which will need addressing in the short to medium term, and these have been identified and passed on to the interim Committee.

Despite the planning application outcome, and the last 18 months lack of activity in the Hall due to Covid-19, routine and un-planned maintenance and repairs have been carried out, including roof timber repairs, window repairs, addressing damp issues, and some re-decorating. In addition, Government grants in excess of £10,000 have been successfully applied for and received.

So, as the present Committee members depart, they are proud and confident that they are handing over a village asset, although not in the form they had wished, for reasons already stated above, in the best material condition expected for a building of this age, for the new Trustees to run as they see fit. The Hall is also financially in the position it was, prior to the Planning Application, and Lockdown.

Our only disappointment is that living in a village which was bequeathed a state of the art community asset by Eleanor Arbuthnot in 1904, we were not able to do the same for our future generations, by creating a new facility on the same footprint as the old.

We wish the new Committee well in the future.

# Recipe of the month: Tuna Fish Roll

## Ideal for Picnics

*This month's recipe is from ACE member, Deidre Morris.*

### Ingredients

- Small packet puff pastry (fresh, frozen or chilled)
- 1 onion, peeled and finely chopped
- 1 can of tuna, drained
- Small packet of frozen mixed vegetables (peas, carrots, green beans, sweet peppers, sweet corn)
- 1 beaten egg
- 6oz/175g grated mild cheese (Edam, Double Gloucester)
- Seasoning

### Method

The pastry should be cool from the fridge, but not frozen.

Roll it out into an oblong, rolling it thin.

Leave the pastry to rest while you prepare the filling.

Sauté the onion in a little butter or oil until soft. Allow to cool.

Put the mixed vegetables into boiling water, return to the boil, drain and rinse in cold water. Allow to cool.

In a bowl thoroughly mix the onion, vegetables, flaked tuna, seasoning, most of the egg and 4oz of cheese.

Spread the mixture evenly over the pastry, to within 2 cms of the edge.

Damp the edges of the pastry with cold water, roll up, swiss roll style, from the long side and seal the edges well. Lift the roll carefully onto a dampened baking sheet and form into a circle or horseshoe.

Using a sharp knife, cut deeply across the roll at 2-3 cm intervals. Brush with egg and bake in the centre of a 220C/425F/gas mark 7 oven for 15 minutes.

Remove, sprinkle with the remaining 2oz of cheese and return to a 190C/375F/gas mark 5 oven for 30 minutes, or until golden brown and cooked through.

Serve hot, with extra vegetables, or cold with salad.

It slices for a buffet or picnic and also freezes well.
